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Materials Requirements and Costs 2010 Graphic Design and Photography

Dear Student

Classes for 2010 will commence on Monday 1 February at 08:10. BTech students will be notified regarding workshops and classes. Second and third year GD students will attend theory lectures and workshops from 08:10-16:30 every day during the first week.

In addition to the usual academic fees payable for enrolment in Graphic Design and Photography courses in 2010 you are also required to make financial provision for the following essential items listed below. Most of the information herein refers to incoming 2nd year students. Items indicated with an asterisk* must be paid directly to the Department, at registration, as they are either ordered for you in bulk, at special prices; or are required to aid your smooth integration into the course and facilities.

3rd and 4th year students please take note of section 1a, 1b and 1c as these fees are also payable by you. Payment procedure is explained in section 4.

1. GENERAL

1a Photocopier and Printers

Colour and B/W Xerox printers and Kodak dye sublimation A5 photographic printer are in the K62 computer lab. All art students can use these and print credits can be purchased at the cashier by using your student number. A new Photocopier machine will be installed downstairs and this will also use the credits on your student account via swiping your student card.

If you are a GD student and want to use the Photocopier upstairs, the following applies: If you are in possession of a Photocopier Key you are not required to purchase another, but will need to have it encoded for use in the Department. A4 paper is provided. The monies for these items are non-refundable upon leaving the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University.

Photocopier Key GD only R30 (If you already have a key it will need to be re-encoded)

Encoding (100 copies) GD only R30

1b Computer Laboratory

This facility is fully equipped with the latest technologies. Students may not store data on the computer hard drives permanently. For this purpose you must use blank CD or DVD disks and USB2 Flash Drives. On average you will require 20 disks per year or equivalent. A good supplier of consumables is Printer Cartridge at 041 373 3136 www.printercartridge.co.za

- Colour laser prints R400* (GD 2 students only, GD 3 students pay on ad hoc basis) This fee will be credited to your name and entitles you to 50 x A3 copies. You will be required to pay in advance for further copies. On average you will require a budget of R1500 per year.
- Min 1 Gig USB2 Flash Drive (2 Gig 4 Gig are strongly recommended if your budget allows).

You will be required to purchase a USB2 Flash Drive (MINIMUM 1 Gigabyte) in order to store digital files while you are working on design projects. Once you have completed a project you are expected to back it up onto CD/DVD for archival purposes.

1c Insurance (ALL STUDENTS)

The insurance excess for accidentally damaged or stolen Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University equipment is R10 000. This excess is payable by you the student. To prevent such a crisis, the Department has arranged a special insurance premium that protects you from paying this extreme amount and limits your liability to R250 per item. The once-off premium covers you for one year from registration until your last examination in November. Students who do not have this insurance will not be allowed access to, or use of, certain pieces of Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University equipment within the Art School including, but not limited to, computers, digital cameras, and video cameras. The equipment will be insured up to a limit of R50 000 per item. The cover extends to equipment on and off the premises, but it must be attended to at all times. Equipment in vehicles will only be covered if it is locked in the boot. If the vehicle is unattended it MUST be secured behind locked gates or in a garage. No unattended items will be covered. Should items be left unattended they must be locked away. The insurers will only pay out if there are *visible signs of forced entry*.

3. CAMERAS AND EQUIPMENT

All students must have their own cameras for any course or course combination in Graphic Design or Photography for 2010.

As all our colour photographic post-production printing systems are digital, students are required to be equipped with digital cameras conforming to the minimum basic requirements set out below. Before making any major purchases of cameras, flash units etc., please confirm your decision with the relevant lecturer.

Photographic suppliers that we deal with include Foto First at Summerstrand Village (next to Friends), Katz Digital World in Newton Park, Kodak at 6th Avenue and at Walker Drive, as well as Teletek. Mike Orms in Cape Town also gives good prices and mail service (www.orms.co.za) and you can also order online from www.sacamera.co.za/.

3a PHOTOGRAPHIC EQUIPMENT for Photography Majors:

Camera <u>must</u> conform to the following basic minimum requirements:

- Digital single lens reflex
- Resolution: at least 8 megapixels.
- Manual exposure override
- RAW function
- Lens with zoom range from wide angle to medium telephoto (probably about 18 55/85mm)
- Camera Memory card at least 2 Gig x2 (SanDisk is recommended)
- Universal flash connector OR hot shoe
- · Remote control facility

Spare rechargeable battery.

The most reasonably priced cameras that we can recommend, conforming to these requirements are the Canon 1000D and the Nikon D3000, both available with 18 – 55mm lenses for around R5500. Or if you can afford something a bit more upmarket you may go for the Canon 500D at about R8000, or the Canon 50D or Nikon D90 at about R17000.

In addition to the camera, the following essential items <u>must</u> be purchased:

- Sturdy medium-sized tripod (Manfrotto is recommended)
- Hot shoe to PC connector (for triggering studio flashes)
- · USB2 Flash Drive, at least 1Gig
- · Mains extension lead
- Multiplug adapter with 3 and 2 pin sockets

As the course progresses, Photography Majors will also need to equip themselves with:

- Flash/ambient light meter (e.g. Sekonic)
- · Flash sync extension cable
- Portable electronic flash
- OR 6xAA batteries, rechargeable NIMH 2800 mAh and charging unit
- Light painting Leisure Quip dual power torch with facility to run from car battery
- Silver / gold closeable reflector. Available from Dept. at lower cost R300
- Photographic portfolio case. Available from Dept. R550
- Remote camera control. Available from Dept. R200
- USB powered portable hard drive is highly recommended

Photographic printing, mounting card, DVD discs, Photostats etc.

3b PHOTOGRAPHIC EQUIPMENT for Graphic Design Majors

Students will need to possess their own digital camera to complete the course.

Although entry level digital SLR's such as Canon 1000D or Nikon D3000 with interchangeable lenses is strongly recommended, certain fixed lens compact digital cameras will be acceptable providing they meet the criteria listed below.

Fixed lens digital cameras must be equipped with the following minimum facilities:

- At least 8 Megapixels of resolution
- Manual exposure override
- Lens with minimum of 4x optical zoom range and with macro (close –up).
- · Should be able to shoot in RAW file format

You can get a suitable camera for under R3000; we would recommend the Canon SX120 IS or the A1100. Also available at a reasonable price is the Fuji S2000. Most of the Nikons in this price range unfortunately only have the "idiot modes" for exposure control, with no manual override, so they are not suitable. A couple of the Kodak cameras in this range have manual override, and one model has the facility for triggering external flash as well. There may be cameras from other brands that are suitable, but we have no experience of them, and don't know how efficient the after sales service would be.

3c GRAPHIC DESIGN EQUIPMENT for Graphic Design Major students

Graphic Markers

These drawing markers are a pre-requisite for the Rendering, Drawing and Technique aspects of the course. You will be supplied with a set of 20 Copic markers as well as an A2 marker pad upon receipt of payment. You will not be admitted to drawing classes on Monday, 8 February without proof of payment for the following items:

Marker Set & 2 bottles of refill ink
Marker Pad
Refill Ink
You will need at least 5-10 refill units within the first week of class

The following equipment is needed for practical classes, please make sure that you obtain these items before classes start:

- Cutting knife (NT or L cutter) with spare blades. This type of knife comes in 2 sizes the larger size is required
- Art knife/stencil knife (looks like a Bic pen with a blade instead of a ballpoint)
- A set of French Curves. Available from general stationers and architectural suppliers
- A circle template -the largest circle should be about 4cm in diameter
- A set square minimum length 20cm
- A steel ruler minimum length 60cm, 100cm is preferable.
- 0.3 clutch pencil
- Glue stick e.g. Pritt
- · Double sided tape. NOT the thick sponge type
- 3M Magic Tape (low tack)
- Spray Mount Adhesive 3M is strongly recommended (VERY IMPORTANT!)
- Pins
- Black Album paper for mounting purposes (available from the Departmental Photography Store when needed)

At last tally this total was approximately R550
